It is time to start detail planning for the 5th IDRC to be held at Wilson College in Chambersburg, PA., August 13-17, 1990.

You are cordially invited to participate as an exhibitor. All exhibits are planned to be in the Science Center where all sessions are held. The purpose is to give your exhibit the maximum exposure to the select group of highly distinguished international scientists attending this conference.

Two types of exhibit accommodations are available. Space is available for sixteen table-top exhibits and three private rooms.

Each table costs \$500. The surface area is 30 x 96 inches capable of supporting approximately 200 pounds of instruments. Stronger tables (30 x 60) may be substituted at no additional cost. Electrical service to each table is 100V/15A. Additional services may be arranged by special request.

Each private room measures 22 x 24 feet which can be divided into two smaller rooms (11 x 24) using sliding partitions. The cost for the large room is \$2000 and the small room is \$1000. Each large room is to have four tables as described above or two per small room. Adequate electrical service is available in all rooms. The week-end prior to the conference is available to set up all exhibits. Take down time is by 3:00 pm Friday, August 17.

All exhibit space is to be assigned on a first-come first-served basis. If you wish to reserve space now, please mail me the check, payable to 5th IDRC. You are encouraged to send one or two scientists to man the exhibit allowing greater interaction with the conferees.

Since its inception in 1982, the conference has operated as a non-profit meeting. Income generated from exhibits provides two valuable assets: 1) top international diffuse reflectance scientists, who would not otherwise be able to attend, can be invited, and 2) promising graduate students can be invited at a reduced cost.

If you elect not to exhibit, then please consider sending one or two of your scientists as conferees. No where else can you find so many of the best d.r. people in such an intimate setting.

I am personally available before and during the conference to see that all your requirements are met. I look forward to working with you as an exhibitor next August. Otherwise, I look forward to meeting you at the conference as a fellow attendee for the exchange of ideas, problems and solutions.
